Technical & Trade Colleges

- 1 to 2 year programs
- Provide training for skilled, high tech workers









Community Colleges

- 1 to 2 year programs
- Degrees & certificates offered
- academic transfer degrees,
- professional-technical degrees
- certificates of achievement.

*Earning an *academic transfer degree* similar to completing the first 2 years at a 4-year college/university.







Four-Year Colleges & Universities

- Typically 4-year programs offering variety of Bachelor's degrees
- A university (as opposed to a college) also offers master's degrees (M.A., M.S.) and doctorates (Ph.D.) for advanced, highly specialized study.







Military Service

- **Educational opportunities**
- Up to 90% tuition assistance for college courses
- Technical training in over 200 skill areas
- G.I. Bill-Tuition for any school



Internships

- An intern is a student undergoing supervised practical training.
- Real-life applications of the skills students learn in school.
- An internship is a way to "try on a job" before deciding on a career.

Apprenticeships

- Training program where you earn wages while learning a skilled profession in a specific field.
- Supervised by a trade professional
- Includes classroom studies and on-the-job training
- Earn a salary while you learn about your trade





Earn While You Learn

Apprenticeships are a great option for people who like to work with their hands and are ready to go to work. They combine classroom training (college credit courses) and paid on-the-job training and last one to five years. Apprentices are eligible for lower college tuition rates.


After successfully completing the program, apprentices earn a journeyworker-level certificate of completion from the Washington State Department of Labor & Industries Apprenticeship and Training Council. This certificate is one of the oldest and most highly portable industry credentials in use today.

The Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) associate degree is designed to transfer to most Bachelor of Arts degrees at all four-year colleges and universities in Washington state. The DTA is sometimes called an Associate in Arts or an Associate in Arts and Sciences.

DTA degrees provide students:

- Priority consideration in the admissions for most humanities and social science majors public universities ahead of students without a degree.
- · Completion of lower division general education requirements.
- Credit for all courses completed within the DTA up to and in some cases beyond 90 credits.
- . Opportunity to explore several fields of study through the category of up to 30 credits of elective courses.
- · Opportunity to complete prerequisites for a future major.

DTA Associate Degree Guidelines

The Intercollege Relations Commission (ICRC) — a unit of The Washington Council — oversees the guidelines for DTAs. The ICRC maintains the most current edition of the ICRC Handbook [PDF] which provides the DTA degree's requirements, provisos and other requirements.
