




WHAT IS AVID?




AVID stands for Advancement Via Individual Determination and it is a year-long class that teaches students the fundamentals of college and career readiness. You will learn helpful skills such as note-taking and collaboration through various interactive lessons and activities.

In AVID you learn many different academic skills to show academic growth in many ways.


Academic skills consist of:

TUTORIALS

We get in a group with questions form together and answer each others questions. One person then asks their question and people will try to answer their question.


