

# H.M. Jackson High School's Kyle Peacocke honored with 2023-24 NFHS Sectional Coaches Award



Mill Creek, WA– H.M. Jackson High School's Kyle Peacocke has been named the recipient of the 2023-24 National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) Sectional Coaches Award for Fastpitch Softball. This prestigious honor recognizes Peacocke's exceptional coaching achievements and his contributions to high school athletics.

During his 13-year tenure as head coach of the Timberwolves softball team, Peacocke established an extraordinary legacy at Jackson High School, leading the team to unprecedented success. Highlights of his career include:

**State championships:** Under his leadership, the Timberwolves captured four Class 4A state titles in five tournament seasons, setting a record for Class 3A and 4A schools in Washington.

Player development: Peacocke guided numerous players to individual accolades, including standout athlete Iyanla De Jesus, who earned the Class 4A State Player of the Year title.

Consistent excellence: The team consistently achieved top-four finishes in state tournaments and became a powerhouse in Washington high school softball.

Peacocke's coaching philosophy emphasized a family-oriented team environment and player development, inspiring his athletes to excel both on and off the field. Many of his players have gone on to compete at the collegiate level, reflecting the strength of his mentorship.

"I can say, without hesitation, that Kyle represents the true meaning of the spirit of coaching our youth through interscholastic activities," said Mick Hoffman, Executive Director of the Washington Interscholastic Activities Association (WIAA), in a letter of congratulations. "He is most deserving of this recognition and has made all of us in the state of Washington proud."

In June 2024, Peacocke stepped down from his coaching role to focus on his family and his responsibilities as the athletic coordinator at Jackson High School.

The NFHS Coaches Association Sectional Coaches Award is a regional honor, with nominees selected from one of eight sections across the United States. Peacocke's recognition places him among the nation's top high school coaches, underscoring his remarkable contributions to the sport and the student-athletes he has inspired.

# **JACKSON FOOTBALL & TRACK**

### How has your coaching philosophy evolved over the years?

"To its core, my coaching philosophy hasn't changed. Our mission is to be in a constant pursuit to unleash our greatness on and off the field as we strive to build Champions of Character. Our mission/program objectives are to, I) Develop Champions of Character as we hunt championships. 2) Educate, Train, and Inspire. 3) Increase school spirit and community involvement. Our 3 Pillars, Attitude, Habits, and Execution are the core values that make everything go for us as a Pack. Every day, we strive to be 3 Strong. Attitude is my compass; it'll show me the direction I am headed. Habits is my vehicle; it will take me where Attitude points. Execution is my destination; it is where Attitude and Habits meet."



### How do you balance the demands of coaching with your personal life?

"This is always hard to do as a coach and probably the thing I struggle with the most even though I would like to think I have gotten better at it. When I am home, I do my best to put my phone, tablet, and computer away so that I may be fully engaged and committed to what we have going on at home. I see my kids very minimally during the week and although I am busy with film breakdown and game planning, I get to watch my boys play football on Saturdays. The life of a coach is a grind, and I couldn't do any of this without my wonderful and amazing wife, Meagann. The balance we have as a family during the season is because of her. My wife is the reason I am able to commit to my craft the only way I know how to...all in! Thank you for always supporting me and our Pack and for being such and amazing mother and partner!"



# What specific strategies have you used to motivate your team?

"The number one thing I try to focus on is the bonds we establish as a team. Just as we strive to be 3 Strong philosophically, we also strive to be 3 Strong relationships wise. It is crucial for our Pack to have great coach to player relationships, player to player relationships and coach to coach relationships. I like to focus on the work and growth of the Pack to validate their efforts and continually show them that hard work pays off. We also do fun things to motivate our kids like PACK Points, Turnover Chain, Helmet decals, Incentives for activities and milestones, Scout team player of the week and various awards at the end of year banquet. We also do a draft and have our Pack compete amongst themselves during the long(off) season."

# COACH SPOTLIGHT STEVE JOHNSON JACKSON BOYS BASKETBALL

How do you keep up with trends and changes in the sport without losing sight of your core principles?

"It's tough! It seems that all sports (perhaps society too?) have a "grass is greener" undercurrent to them right now, in terms of people wanting instant gratification or something different before putting in the time, effort into the situation they are currently in. Trying to stay grounded in our own program and the kids in it, I attempt to consciously think about what I can control, and focus as much of my energy as possible on these controllables."



### What are the key qualities you believe every coach should develop in order to be successful?

"Passion, organization, and flexibility. One has to really care about kids and their program first and foremost, while planning effectively, and then adjusting/deviating from plans as time and your season unfolds."





What are some strategies you've used to maintain longterm success, and how do you adapt over the years?

"Building a program from the ground up (community, youth programs, developmental levels) and then working to maintain these foundations. As far as adapting, reviewing my own performance after each season and considering what to change, keep, etc fosters adaptation, I like to think. Additionally, surrounding yourself with quality people who will tell you the truth as they see it helps this also."

# COACH SPOTLIGHT ANGIE CRITTENDEN

### How has coaching changed you personally and professionally?

\*Coaching has enriched my life. Sometimes, you don't know what you're missing until it shows up. I love working with all my athletes, and I find it's hard to let them go at the end of our season. My coaching experience has enhanced my awareness, appreciation, and empathy for what some student athletes are facing in their lives. Some of my personal skills and abilities have been strengthened through my coaching experiences that have translated into my professional life."



### What is your coaching philosophy, and how does it shape

your approach with athletes?

"My primary goal in coaching is to nurture and foster the love of whatever sport it is that I'm coaching at the time, whether it's volleyball, track and field, or soccer. I have found that when athletes are excited about and love what they're doing, they're more committed and engaged. My hope is that they will continue with the sport well beyond their school years and into adulthood, whether it's competitive or just recreational. I strive to strike a balance between a positive and encouraging coaching mindset while still maintaining a focus on skill development, accountability, and individual progress. I also do my best to help athletes develop team skills, support each other, and thrive within a team environment."

# What trends do you see emerging in your sport that athletes and coaches should be aware of?

"Volleyball continues to become increasingly popular, compared to some other sports. It has become more difficult to just be athletic without specific volleyball training prior to trying out for High School Volleyball with the hopes of making a team. Also, Club teams for any sport, including volleyball, have made it even more difficult for athletes to be able to play more than one sport in High School, versus what it used to be."

Congratulations to all of the members participated in the for a state swimming dive, which took place this past weekend. Congratulations to the following:


