their regular season of District play with a well deserved WIN at the PNW Glacier Peak District Event. We finished the qualification matches in 1st place, a position we fought hard for all weekend. For most of the weekend the FIRST Robotics joint team from Cascade and Everett High Schools were in 1st place, Otter Chaos – Team 4512 demonstrated skill and accuracy and proved themselves a formidable alliance partner. Though their team drove with skill their bot was no match for Jack In The Bot's swerve drive which allowed our bot to glide around the field with speed and precision.

In the end Jack In The Bot finished in 1st place and Otter Chaos finished in 3rd place. Glacier Peak was our most intense competition of the season; most teams had already played at least one match and were primed with

improvements and strategy! The drive team (Jacob Bublitz, Timothy Tien, Aspen Perry, David Wairera and coach Patrick Woolfenden) consistently improved over the course of the event keeping a focused and winning attitude the team ended the competition with a 10 - 2 - 0 record.

During the match team members in the stands did their job of cheering and scouting jumping to their feet often to cheer on outstanding play by their drive team on the field. During match 60, out of 76, our team scored 102 points in a clean match (no penalty points) breaking the current **WORLD RECORD FOR THE SEASON OF CLEAN MATCH POINTS EARNED**!

Our team was also awarded the <u>Quality Award</u> which celebrates a machines robustness in concept and fabrication.
