

Welcome to the **ART** Room



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Kindergarteners are busy learning and exploring what it means to work like an artist! Through hands-on table centers, students experiment with different materials and tools to understand how they are used. They are also practicing how to care for supplies and clean up their workspace responsibly.
Language Focus - Lines: vertical, diagonal, horizontal, straight, curved
Geometric Shapes: circle, oval, rectangle, square, triangle, rhombus, hexagon

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First graders are continuing to make literacy connection in art as they learn about settings, the place where something happens. They used watercolors to paint farm **landscapes**, setting, for their adorable scarecrows which they created using paper **shapes**.
Second graders explored **still life** paintings by the French artist, Paul Cézanne. Using tempera paint, they mixed their own colors and painted apples using **organic shapes**.
Organic shapes are free-flowing, irregular and curvy shapes often found in nature.

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Third graders are exploring **fiber arts** and learning to weave using yarn and a paper plate as their loom. They're practicing patience, focus, and fine motor skills. All students are highly engaged! They can't wait to finish and bring their creations home.
Clay is here! Fourth graders are the first to use it this year, and they're making fall leaves using clay slabs and textured leaf patterns. The clay needs to dry, get fired, **glazed**, and fired again, the whole process takes around 15-20 days. Students are eagerly waiting.

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My Identity is a Superpower! Our identity is made up of the qualities, experiences, and beliefs that make each of us unique. It can be shaped by family, friends, culture, and the world around us. Students recently completed their *Identity Letter* art project, where they explored what makes them who they are. 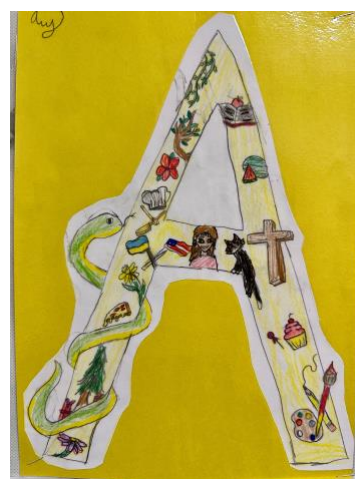
